Celebrating School Partners

UPMC Children's Healthy Schools Program, in partnership with the Alliance for a Healthier Generation, supports over 80 schools in the Pittsburgh region in implementing best practices focusing on the *Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child* model.

We'd like to recognize and celebrate every one of these schools for their efforts to create a healthier environment for students, staff and families during the 2023-24 school year.

This year, an astounding 46 school partners became eligible for the prestigious award of, *America's Healthiest Schools*. This eligibility is a testament to the exceptional efforts of regional schools to advance the well-being of their school

communities by Improving Nutrition and Food Access,
Strengthening Social and Emotional Health, Cultivating
Staff Well-Being, and Promoting Tobacco-Free Schools. The
efforts of these schools in collaboration with UPMC Children's
and the Alliance for a Healthier Generation have pivoted them
toward becoming among the healthiest in the nation.

Expanding Families' Food Budgets with Food Bucks Rx

UPMC Children's is pleased to offer card-based Food Bucks Rx, a Produce Prescription program provided to UPMC Children's patient families in partnership with <u>The Food Trust</u>. 280 families with children have enrolled in the 6-month program during their pediatric healthcare visit and are receiving up to \$100 per month, via a debit-like card, to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables at participating locations

including Allegheny County farmers markets. While enrollment in the card-based program has ended, many UPMC Children's clinical settings are still distributing Food Bucks Rx paper coupons. See more information about how to access and navigate local farmers markets in sections below.






Promoting Safety in Western Pa

Keep an eye out for Children's Safety Van around town this summer! UPMC Children's Injury Prevention team has been traveling far and wide to promote safety throughout the region. They recently held a safe storage event in collaboration with UPMC Hamot and the Erie Blue Coats in Erie, Pa. where they distributed 100 gun safes to community members. At the Crawford County 4-H Safety Day, they encouraged helmet safety on bicycles and ATVs, and they've been on the school circuit educating teens on the consequences of impaired driving - shown in the photo here from Clairton High School. Blasting Off into Literacy

An "out of this world" space-themed literacy adventure provided more than 100 children and families from neighborhoods in and around Braddock, Rankin, Penn Hills, Lawrenceville, Hilltop and Turtle Creek with an unforgettable experience. Hosted by UPMC Children's Family Care Connection (FCC) at the Rankin Christian Center, partners from WQED, Moonshot Museum, Buzzwords, Reading Ready Pittsburgh and others introduced families to resources available in their own communities.

Highlights included a kickoff from Mad Science who demonstrated how air moves through space by shooting potatoes across the room and blowing balloons up in bottles. The oohs and aahs from the children in attendance were remarkable. Guided by FCC's Child Development Specialists (aka, astronauts), families then traveled through four space stations including puppet play with Moonshot Museum, rocket ship art and story time with Reading Ready Pittsburgh, phases of the moon art activity with Buzzwords, and a rocket ship ride movement station with ACH Clear Pathways.

They ended their space flight with a boxed lunch, DK's My Best Pop-up Space Book, a space passport sticker book, and an astronaut fidget toy to keep the fun going once they arrived back home on planet Earth!

Farmers Market Season is Back

Now through November, farmers markets around the county are open and accepting many forms of payment. Families receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP/food stamps), SUN Bucks, and Food Bucks can use their benefits at the market by finding the Fresh Access tent and asking about how to use their cards or coupons. For every \$5 spent with an EBT card, recipients receive an extra \$2 coupon for fresh fruits and vegetables to use at the market.

SUN Bucks: Summer Food Dollars for Families with School-Aged Children

This summer, many Pennsylvania families will receive SUN Bucks, the 2024 Pennsylvania Summer EBT program that provides food dollars to low-income families with school-aged children during the summer months. Households will receive a one-time payment of \$120 for each eligible child. These benefits can be used at farmers markets and other participating grocery locations.
