Centers also provide parent education, child development, mental health support, connection to community services and resources, and more.

# Resources to Help Quit Smoking/Tobacco

Quitting smoking is hard. Some people try to stop many times before they succeed. Trying is part of the process. <u>Don't give up</u>. You can do this!

\* If a family member wants to quit smoking, they can ask their child's pediatrician to write for nicotine patches and gum that can be picked up from the pharmacy. Typically covered by the adult insurance plans.

**Pennsylvania Quit Line**: 1-800-QUIT-NOW (1-800-784-8669). Get up to five calls from a quit coach, two or more weeks of nicotine replacement

therapy if available, unlimited support during high risk for using tobacco.

<u>Pregnancy Protocol</u> especially to help women during pregnancy.
