This is the doorway that will lead me back to my IR room.






IR Room

This is the room where I will have my procedure.






After laying on the bed, the doctors and nurses will put these helpers on my body to keep me safe.

When the procedure is done, the medicine stops and my body starts to wake up.





The Recovery Room (PACU)

This is the room I will wake up in when my procedure is all done!
