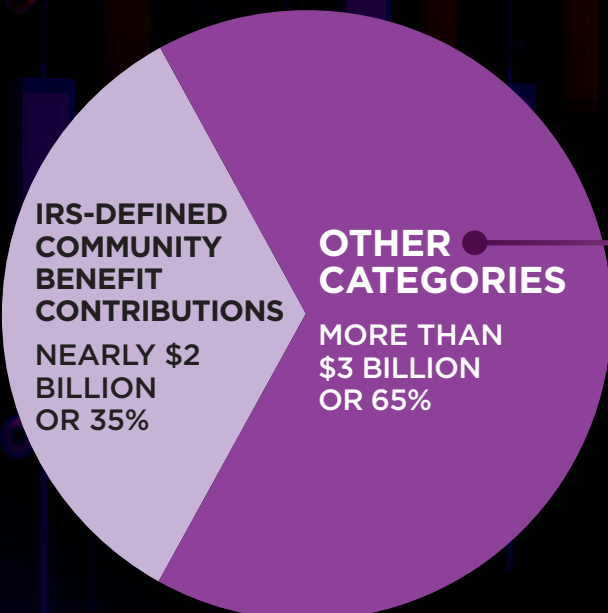

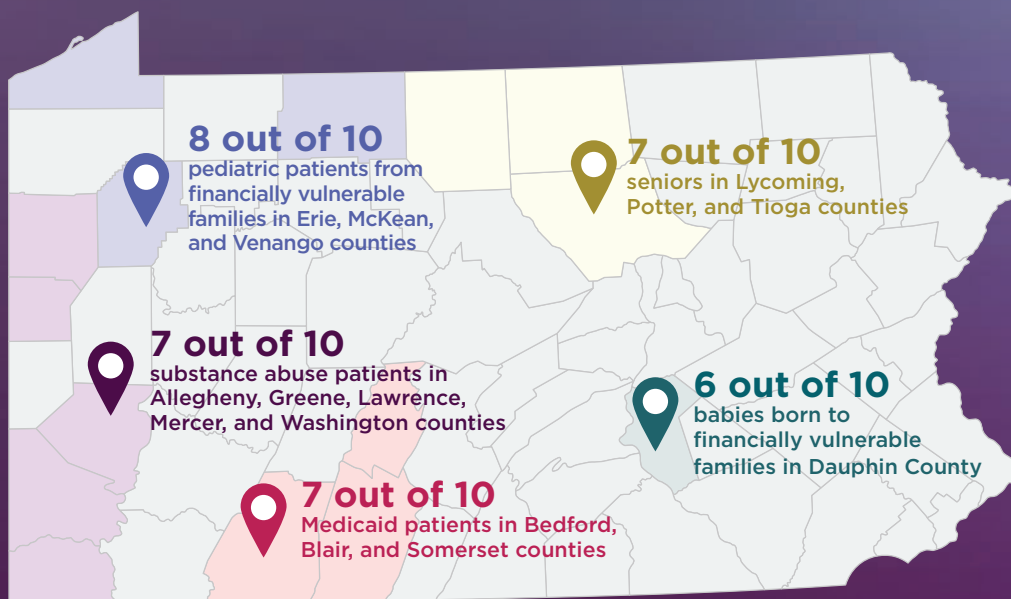

HEALTH CARE FOR THOSE IN NEED

UPMC provides access to high-quality care for individuals and families who are uninsured or underinsured, reinforcing its role as a safety net provider. In 2025, UPMC dedicated \$658 million to charity care and unreimbursed Medicaid costs, with \$169 million to support patients who needed charity care and financial assistance, and \$489 million to cover unreimbursed costs for Medicaid beneficiaries and other subsidized care.

Addressing Critical Gaps in Health Care Access

UPMC is deeply committed to serving communities across its regions by expanding access to high-quality care and addressing local health needs.

Delivering Care to Rural Populations

To reduce barriers to care, UPMC delivers high-quality services directly to rural communities through its Mobile Health Center — a fully equipped clinic on wheels. Consistent with that, in central Pennsylvania, UPMC launched a Women's Mobile Health Unit, offering breast and pelvic exams, as well as health education, to communities in York, Dauphin, Lancaster, and Perry counties.

Supporting Those Experiencing Homelessness

UPMC Health Plan's Cultivating Health for Success, a supportive housing program that targets members experiencing homelessness, reached a milestone with the 200th housed member.

Increasing Access for Communities in Need

In December 2025, UPMC Vision Institute hosted the first-ever Community Vision Day, offering free eye care services for uninsured and underinsured community members. In addition, UPMC Hamot and UPMC Chautauqua proudly support Remote Area Medical (RAM) clinics, bringing essential health care services to underserved communities. These clinics offer free, high-quality medical, dental, and vision care to individuals in need, regardless of insurance or identification.

BUILDING STRONGER, HEALTHIER COMMUNITIES

At UPMC, life changing means putting people and communities first. Every day, our 100,000 employees work to provide essential resources across the region.

In 2025, UPMC dedicated \$634 million to health and wellness programs and charitable contributions, underscoring its commitment to community health. These contributions supported initiatives that expand access to care, address social determinants of health, and strengthen community partnerships.

Reaching Out in So Many Ways

UPMC is enhancing health and wellness through more than 3,000 free and subsidized community programs:

- Immunizations, screenings, home visits, and transportation.
- Support for seniors, children, new moms, and people with disabilities.
- Emergency preparedness, access to healthy foods, cancer awareness, and job readiness training.



Partnerships that Make a Difference

UPMC is dedicated to reducing barriers to better community health. We generously support community, arts, and educational groups, and organizations focused on caring for the less fortunate.

Partnerships include:

- UPMC partnered with VA Healthcare to roll out a Pennsylvania statewide community nurse liaison program, which offers veterans care coordination, better hospital admission and discharge planning, and improved inpatient experiences. In February 2026, UPMC Hamot and the Erie VA Medical Center signed a veterans' care pledge recognizing the start of the VA-UPMC Community Nurse Liaison Program at UPMC Hamot.
- UPMC in North Central Pa. launched a maternal health pilot program in partnership with the Department of Health and Department of Human Services in Clinton County.
- In January 2026, UPMC announced a \$10 million contribution to the City of Pittsburgh to support the replacement of the city's aging fleet of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) vehicles and equipment.

MAKING CARE MORE ACCESSIBLE

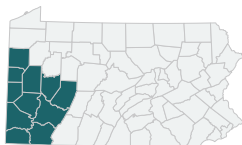
UPMC-GoHealth Urgent Care

UPMC is enhancing access to care by expanding ambulatory sites and leveraging telemedicine. In 2025, UPMC advanced its commitment to accessible, high-quality, community-based care through the launch of UPMC-GoHealth Urgent Care, a joint venture that encompasses **more than 80 centers across Pennsylvania and West Virginia**. UPMC enhanced access and the patient experience by adding specialty and primary care services to UPMC-GoHealth Urgent Care centers, expanding the reach of the provider network and enhancing continuity of care.



COMMITTED TO THE HEALTH OF OUR REGIONS

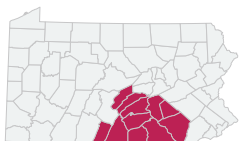

INVESTING IN THE LONG-TERM VITALITY OF SOUTHWEST PENNSYLVANIA

UPMC delivers high-quality, accessible care across southwest Pennsylvania through strategic partnerships and expanded services.

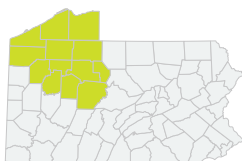
- UPMC Washington and UPMC Greene marked their first year with UPMC in June 2025. Since joining the system, access to care has expanded significantly — including pediatric emergency consultations through UPMC Children’s, enhanced orthopaedic, oncology, and surgical services, and more robust women’s health offerings in partnership with UPMC Magee-Womens.
- Construction continues on the new Daniel G. and Carole L. Kamin Tower, named in recognition of a transformative \$65 million gift. The 636-bed, state-of-the-art facility will feature leading-edge technology to enhance the patient experience and transform the delivery of care in western Pennsylvania. Scheduled to welcome its first patients in 2027, the Kamin Tower will elevate patient-centered care for decades to come.



ENHANCING STATE-OF-THE-ART CARE IN CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA

UPMC continues to deepen its investment in central Pennsylvania through innovative partnerships, expanded specialty care, and state-of-the-art facilities that meet the evolving needs of the region’s communities.

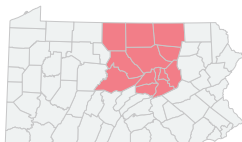
- UPMC Harrisburg established a new pediatric flight service to transfer critically ill pediatric patients.
- UPMC Memorial, in York County, introduced a cardiac surgery and structural heart clinic, delivering expert cardiovascular care closer to home.



MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN ERIE, PENNSYLVANIA

UPMC is dedicated to improving health and well-being in Erie and northwest Pennsylvania.

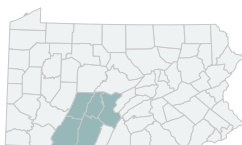
- In July 2025, UPMC opened its first Neighborhood Center in Erie. This new center builds on the success of the Pittsburgh model and offers services that go beyond health care — including workforce development, food access, and financial education.



CARING FOR RURAL RESIDENTS IN NORTH CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA

UPMC is transforming rural health care delivery in north central Pennsylvania through innovative programs that expand access, improve outcomes, and support community well-being.

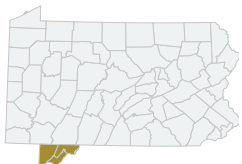
- UPMC launched the Rural Family Medicine Residency Program, designed to train physicians to meet the unique needs of rural communities, and implemented a women’s health model, creating a sustainable, regional approach to maternity care that supports mothers and infants in rural communities.



EXPANDING CARE IN WEST CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA

UPMC is addressing mental health needs in Blair County and surrounding communities by expanding access to specialized care and enhancing the patient experience throughout the region.

- In July 2025, UPMC Altoona opened a new behavioral health pod in its Emergency Department. This innovative space offers a dedicated, safe, and therapeutic environment for patients seeking emergency treatment for behavioral health conditions, separate from the traditional emergency department.



KEEPING CARE LOCAL IN WESTERN MARYLAND

UPMC is making significant strides in expanding local access to high-quality care by actively recruiting providers across a range of specialties and expanding virtual care capabilities.

- UPMC Western Maryland strengthened access to care by expanding primary and specialty services, supported by a multidisciplinary team across primary care, gastroenterology, OB/GYN, and trauma surgery. The hospital also partnered with independent providers and strengthened its specialty care footprint by expanding access to neurology and neurosurgery.

LEADING THE WAY FOR RESEARCH AND EDUCATION

UPMC is recognized around the world as a leader in breakthrough research and medical education. In 2025, UPMC dedicated \$652 million to support these efforts.

Advancing Medicine Together

UPMC partners with the University of Pittsburgh to combine unmatched innovation, research, and clinical expertise with a deep commitment to put people at the heart of everything we do. Together, we attracted nearly \$700 million in National Institutes of Health funding in 2025, ranking in the top ten nationally.

Educating Tomorrow's Caregivers

UPMC is a frontrunner in funding education for health professionals in Pennsylvania. UPMC provides a range of high-quality medical education programs, including accredited training for residents, physicians, nurses, and allied health professionals.

- More than 1,900 medical residents and clinical fellows are trained each year in the nation's fifth-largest medical residency program.
- In 2025, UPMC Schools of Nursing graduated more than 570 nursing students.

UPMC contributes more than half of all hospital-funded research in Pennsylvania.

In 2025, UPMC invested \$277 million to develop physicians, nurses, pharmacists, and other health care professionals.



Launched Pennsylvania's First State-Approved Registered Nurse Resident (RNR) Apprenticeship Program

In April 2025, the UPMC Jameson School of Nursing at UPMC Hamot received approval for Pennsylvania's first Registered Nurse Resident (RNR) apprenticeship program. This innovative model blends academic instruction with paid clinical experience, creating a structured, supportive pathway for new nurses to transition into practice while earning a wage.

CREATING JOBS AND INVESTING IN COMMUNITIES

More Than \$50 Billion Economic Impact

UPMC accounts for more than a quarter of the statewide economic impact of Pennsylvania hospitals.



UPMC and its employees paid **\$3.2 billion in taxes** in 2025, supporting local schools, infrastructure, and other public services.



Supported nearly **206,000 total jobs** directly and indirectly (estimated).

Spent **\$333 million** in 2025 with veteran-owned and other disadvantaged businesses to deliver equal access to procurement opportunities.



Added approximately **3,700 new union jobs** during the construction of new hospitals.



PATHWAYS TO OPPORTUNITY

At UPMC, investing in communities means creating pathways to opportunity — through job training, workforce development, and inclusive hiring practices that uplift individuals and strengthen local economies.



Freedom House Foundations

UPMC Health Plan's Pathways to Work initiative, the Freedom House Foundations training program, celebrated a major milestone in 2025 — its 200th graduate since the program's inception. The program provides essential skills training and pathways to careers in health care. This year, Freedom House Foundations expanded its reach, with graduation ceremonies in Allegheny, Dauphin, and Erie counties.

Facilities and Maintenance Apprenticeship Program

This paid four-year apprenticeship program offers a pathway to the skilled trades through hands-on training and mentorship. Apprentices work full-time while receiving on-the-job training and participating in online learning towards a certificate program.



In 2025, UPMC increased minimum starting wages for entry-level positions to **\$18 an hour** at UPMC's Pittsburgh hospitals, and Harrisburg and Williamsport-area hospitals, outpatient clinics, ambulatory centers, and other facilities and sites.



Project SEARCH

UPMC partners with Project SEARCH to offer a one-year transition program for high school students with intellectual disabilities. Through immersive, real-world experiences at UPMC hospitals, students gain critical job skills, build confidence, and prepare for meaningful employment.
