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### Complications for Hip and Knee Patients

The number shows the complication rate for planned, first time knee and/or hip replacement. Lower numbers are better.

The complications include:

1. Heart attack, pneumonia, or sepsis (infection)/shock during the surgical admission or within 7 days of admission
2. Surgical site bleeding, pulmonary embolism (blood clot), or death during the surgical admission or within 30 days of admission
3. Mechanical complications or periprosthetic joint infection/wound infection during the surgical admission or within 90 days of admission
