



UPMC COVID-19 Vaccination Recommendations

Last Updated: 9/29/2023

For Children and Adults Ages 5 Years and Older

Vaccine History:

Unvaccinated or Vaccinated

2023-2024 Seasonal COVID-19 Vaccine:

Moderna (1 dose)
8 weeks or more after last dose

For Children Ages 6 Months to 4 Years*

Vaccine History:

Unvaccinated

Moderna (2 doses)**
4-8 weeks apart

Vaccinated with Moderna or Pfizer (1 or more doses)

Moderna (1 dose)***
8 weeks or more after last dose

*For those aged 6 months to 4 years, receiving the vaccine from the same manufacturer (Moderna/Pfizer) is recommended. If you cannot confirm which vaccine you previously received, you may get Moderna.

**For those who receive Pfizer, 3 doses of Pfizer is recommended. Talk with your provider about the timing.

***For those who received 1 dose of Pfizer, 2 doses of mRNA (Moderna or Pfizer) vaccine is recommended. For those who received 2 or more doses of Pfizer, 1 dose of mRNA (Moderna or Pfizer) vaccine is recommended. Talk with your provider about the timing.

For those Immunocompromised

For Immunocompromised Children and Adults Ages 6 Months and Older*

Vaccine History:

2023-2024 Seasonal COVID-19 Vaccine:

Unvaccinated

Moderna (3 doses)****

First 2 doses given 4 weeks apart. Third dose given 4 weeks or more after the 2nd dose.

**Vaccinated with
Moderna or Pfizer
(1 dose)**

Moderna (2 doses)****

4 weeks or more after last dose

**Vaccinated with
Moderna or Pfizer
(2 or more doses)**

Moderna (1 dose)****

4-8 weeks or more after last dose

**Vaccinated with
Novavax OR Johnson
& Johnson (J&J)
(Ages 12+)**

Moderna (1 dose)****

8 weeks or more after last dose

Additional doses may be given 8 weeks or more after the last 2023-2024 dose, if recommended by your provider.

*For those aged 6 months to 4 years, receiving the vaccine from the same manufacturer (Moderna/Pfizer) is recommended. If you cannot confirm which vaccine you previously received, you may get Moderna.

****If you choose to receive Pfizer, talk with your provider about the timing.
