TRAINING	The successful completion of an approved postgraduate residency program in Family Medicine
CERTIFICATION	To be eligible for family practice privileges, the applicant is required to either be board certified in family practice or have successfully completed three years in a family practice residency training program approved by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education. Specialty or subspecialty board certification must be obtained within two attempts or within four years of becoming eligible to take the exam, in order to retain staff privileges in the specialty or subspecialty.
OTHER	Documentation of competency in any of the following procedures is required prior to granting of privileges. Documentation of competency may include, but is not limited to, letters from training directors, previous hospital privileges, letters of endorsement from other practitioners, or continuing medical education certification.: - Flexible Sigmoidscopy - Paracentesis - Thoracentesis - Placement of Central Venous Infusion Line - Colposcopy - Cervical Cryotherapy - Endometrial Aspiration - Vasectomy
