

UPMC SCHOOL OF NURSING TRANSFER OF CREDIT AND SUPPORT COURSES

As part of the overall curriculum plan, students complete the following non-nursing courses provided by our partner universities. These courses are transferable from an accredited college or university if the course was completed within a specific timeframe. The total course credits must match exactly, and the student's final grade must be a letter grade "C" or better. A maximum of twenty-one (21) non nursing credits can be transferred in at the time of entry.

Course	Credits	General Course Description	Expiration
Introductory College Writing	3	Writing seminar provides students with practice in critical reading, analytical thinking, and academic writing.	None
Biomedical Ethics	3	Ethical seminar arising from recent biomedical innovations or issues that might arise within the medical profession and patient relationships.	None
Human Growth and Development	3	Provides an overview of the physical, cognitive, social, and emotional development of human beings through the life span.	None
Anatomy and Physiology 1	4*	An introductory and comprehensive study of the anatomy and physiology of the human body; Class and laboratory experiences are required.	5 years
Anatomy and Physiology 2	4*	A continuation of the comprehensive study of the anatomy and physiology of the human body; In-depth understanding of the principles of the body and inter relationships; Class and laboratory experiences are required.	5 years
Microbiology	4	A study of microscopic organisms and their relation to health and disease. There is a special emphasis on disinfection sterilization, immunology, and microbiological aspects of disease; Class and laboratory experiences are required.	5 years

Anatomy and Physiology I and II must be completed at the same institution to be eligible for transfer.

UPMC School of Nursing requires an official transcript to consider credits for transfer. Upon review of a student's materials during the application review, we will evaluate any official college or university transcripts that are included with the application.
