Walk-in mammogram screenings held

As part of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, UPMC hosted its sixth annual Breast Cancer Walk-In Mammogram Screening at multiple locations across our region throughout October.

Women age 40 and over, who are eligible through their insurance for a mammogram and who do not already have a scheduled mammogram, received one without an appointment. Those without health insurance were encouraged to participate as assistance was provided to cover the cost.
