
Your Pregnancy Calendar




What to Expect in the Hospital After Your Delivery

- You will watch educational videos about preventing Shaken Baby Syndrome and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and will be given printed discharge instructions specific to your care needs.
- You will learn more about breastfeeding/chestfeeding and receive expert assistance as needed.
- You will receive routine blood testing.

 We welcome 1 support person to stay with you overnight.

What to Expect in the Hospital for Your Baby

- Your baby will receive a hepatitis B vaccine and routine medicines and testing to keep them healthy.
- Your baby will be seen by a doctor.
- If you have a baby boy, you can choose to have him circumcised.
- To support successful feeding, UPMC does not provide pacifiers. If you would like your baby to use a pacifier, you may bring one from home.

To-Do List

- ☐ Check with your insurance provider to see if you are eligible to receive a breast pump.
- \square Get rest when you can.
- Keep track of how you are feeling and let your provider know if you are experiencing feelings of depression or anxiety.
- ☐ Wear the purple

 "I Delivered" bracelet
 that you received in the
 hospital. In case of a
 medical emergency,
 this bracelet lets care
 providers, and those
 around you, know that
 you recently had a baby.
- ☐ Schedule follow-up visits for you and your baby.

You may be able to leave the hospital anywhere between 24 to 72 hours after delivery. Your care team will review recovery-based milestones with you during your stay to determine when you and your baby are ready to leave.



When you leave the hospital, you may receive a follow-up phone call from a UPMC childbirth expert. Please let us know how you are doing. We are here to answer any questions you may have.
