## Retreat and Refresh Stroke Camp

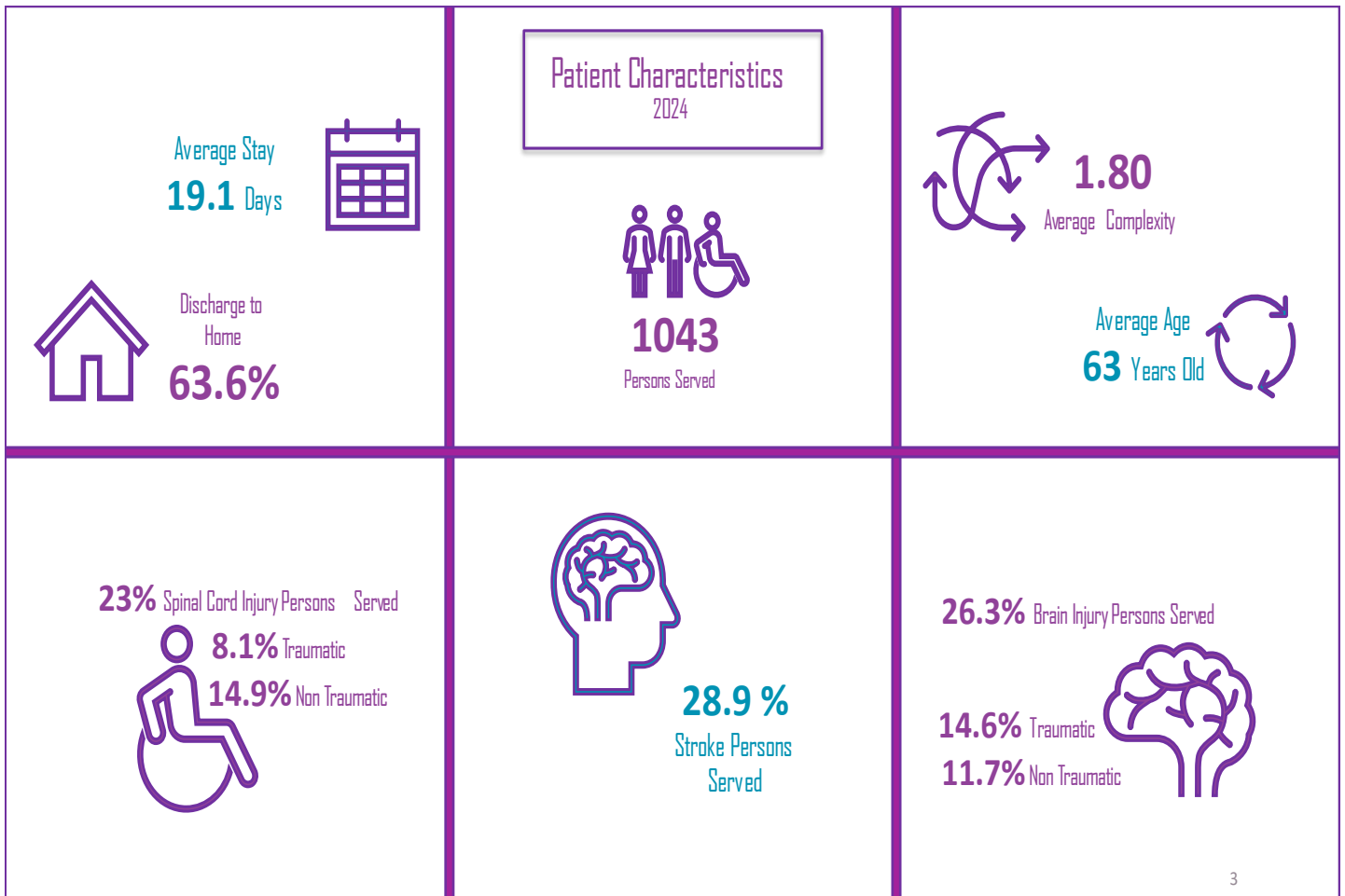

With UPMC Mercy having 3 specialty units, a high percentage of patients are admitted with diagnoses related to Stroke, Brain Injury and Spinal Cord Injury - making up 82% of the patient population.

Our programs accept more medically complex patients compared to other programs in the nation. Our goal is to improve our patient's quality of life and functional independence.
