The UPMC Student Nurse Internship (SNI) Program is a 10-week*, paid internship opportunity for students who have completed their junior year or equivalent to gain hands-on experience while working with an experienced nurse preceptor in a 1-on-1 setting.

*The SNI Program will run from May 23 – July 29, 2022

What You Need to Know

Whether you are a Preceptor, Unit Director, Clinician, or in any role on a participating unit in our SNI Program, you can contribute to the learning, development, and integration of any Student Nurse Intern (SNI) on your unit.

- Remember SNIs are full-time, temporary employees eager to gain hands-on experience and should be held accountable for our policies & values
 - o Please be patient with our SNIs as they have varying clinical experience, but they are looking to gain their confidence and build their skills
 - o SNIs should not work OT or holidays
 - i.e., Memorial Day/4th of July
 - Not permitted to work after 11:59 p.m. the day prior to a holiday due to Holiday Pay
- IMPORTANT: SNIs can NOT perform some patient care activities*, including NO passing medications, hanging or maintaining IVs, or administration of blood or blood products
 - *Refer to <u>Skills Checklist PA & MD or Skills Checklist NY</u> for complete list of tasks an SNI can <u>NOT</u> perform
- Lead by example remember to live our Key Behaviors
- Provide necessary feedback foster a learning environment; consult with your UD & SNI Hospital Coordinator for any support needed or questions regarding your SNI and their performance
- Encourage SNIs to keep an open mind throughout the summer experience
- Future Nursing Opportunities: Make a positive impression; help educate the SNI on nursing support and graduate nurse opportunities to stay within the UPMC family post-program
 - o **Note:** SNIs can apply for and potentially receive an offer for a GN role up to a year in advance of graduation. The Nursing University Relations & Candidate Engagement (NURCE) team will hold an event in June to discuss the Early GN Recruitment Process; encourage SNIs to attend. If SNIs have questions on this process, direct them to reach out to the <u>NURCE team</u>.
- Shadow Opportunities: Provide a warm welcome to SNIs who are shadowing on your unit, introduce them to your department, and create a positive experience during their time visiting on your unit

Roles/Responsibilities

Preceptor

- SNI should follow primary preceptor's schedule; if not possible, plan ahead, communicate in person and note on the schedule
- Ensure progress & sign-off on Skills Checklist
- Complete *midpoint* and *final* SNI evaluation
 - o The Skills Checklist & evaluations must be completed and returned to your hospital's SNI BU Coordinator at the end of the SNI program

UD/Clinician/Charge Nurse

• Determine alternate preceptor if assigned preceptor is not available
