WHAT IS THE RECOVERY / ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM?

The UPMC General Internal Medicine Recovery Engagement Program is a clinic located in UPMC Mercy Outpatient Health Center. Our program is for patients with any current or previous opioid use problem.

The clinic provides these services and more to help you:

- Addiction medicine consultation and treatment
- Harm reduction kits
- Medication-assisted treatment (MAT), including buprenorphine (Suboxone®, Sublocade®, and Brixadi®) and naltrexone (Vivitrol®)
- Ongoing mental health counseling
- Primary medical care and wound care
- Psychiatry
- Social support from peers with lived experience
- Testing and treatment for viral and sexually transmitted infections like HIV and Hepatitis C
- Treatment of common co-occurring conditions, such as pain, anxiety, depression, and ADHD



MULTIDISCIPLINARY APPROACH

While participating in the Recovery Engagement Program, you'll have access to a multidisciplinary team of professionals specially trained to help manage recovery efforts, including:

- Physician Assistants
- Medical Assistants
- Physicians
- Registered Nurses
- Mental Health Therapists
- Patient Services Representatives
- Peer Navigators

The entire team works closely together, and shares information to assure the best plan of care for you.

ELIGIBILITY

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Meet the criteria for an opioid use disorder diagnosis
- Commit to program engagement by meeting with your health care provider and treatment team regularly
- Provide UPMC-accepted health insurance
