

What is the Recovery Engagement Program?

The Recovery Engagement Program is a clinic located in UPMC Mercy Outpatient Health Center. Our program is for patients with any current or previous opioid use problem.

The clinic provides these services and more to help you:

- Full access to primary care services and physicians
- Face-to-face meeting with a Recovery Engagement Program team member within one business day of referral
- Comprehensive professional assessment
- Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) including sub-lingual or injectable buprenorphine
- Hepatitis C treatment
- Behavioral health counseling
- Community-based social support and guidance from peer recovery specialists
- Social services support from licensed social workers

Multidisciplinary Approach

While participating in the Recovery Engagement Program you will have access to a multidisciplinary team of professionals specially trained to help manage recovery efforts including:

- Physicians
 Counselors
 Peer Recovery
- Nurses
 Social Workers
 Specialists

The entire team works closely together, and shares information to assure the best plan of care for you.

Eligibility

- Age 18 years of age or older
- A current or previous problem with opioid abuse
- Commitment to recovery and program engagement
- Self-referred or professionally referred
