Forms

Forms can be submitted via MyUPMC, mail, or fax to the office. If the form is for disability or time off from work, please specify the reason and dates requested. We aim to complete all forms within one week of receipt. Forms brought to the office will be given to your care team to complete within seven days.

Please call in advance to schedule blood work or if you have an acute problem and need to be seen. Please note we don't have a walk-in clinic.

SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT

Call **412-692-4888**, Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. You can also make an appointment online through MyUPMC.

MyUPMC allows you to manage your health online. Once you get an account, you can:

- **Get non-urgent advice from your provider. We respond within two business days.**
- **Renew prescriptions. Please allow us two business days to process refills. We don't refill controlled medications like opioids after hours or on weekends.**
- **Review your medical history and test results.**
- **Schedule appointments.**
- **Submit blood sugar and blood pressure readings to your doctor.**
